There were many events connected with the show however the highlight for us was the TransAm seminar on Saturday morning featuring TransAm luminaries from the 1966 to 1972 *Glory Years* of the TransAm Series.

The Grand Ballroom of the Ritz-Carlton was packed for the seminar with over 600 people in attendance.

Jan and I decided to sit in the back row. When asked if we could move over to make room for more people I asked the person to my right if the two seats between us were taken, to my surprise it was Parnelli Jones and sitting next to him was George Follmer. Parnelli Jones is the Honorary Chairman for the 2008 Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance. A few minutes later Dan Gurney came by and sat down. We were able to spend a few minutes talking to them before they were introduced and made their way to the dais.

Bill Warner, chairman and founder of the Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance, began the session with a brief history of the 1966 to 1972 TransAm series. A video of the exciting TransAm competition of the era accompanied Mr. Warners remarks.

David Hobbs, a TransAm veteran himself, conducted the question and answer session with Parnelli Jones, George Follmer, Sam Posey, Dan Gurney, John Morton, Horst Kewch, Tony Adamowicz, Tom Yeager, Bert Everet, Judy Stropus, Peter Brock, Gib Hufstader and surprise guest, Bud Moore.

The panel recalled many interesting and humorous stories, including those involving, let's say, "the stretching of the rules".







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Saturday afternoon we brought the cars from the trailer area, along the local streets and in the main entrance of the Ritz-Carlton Hotel on the way to the display area.





We were at Bridgehampton for an Open Practice day in the early 1970's when a production company arrived to shoot a commercial with Car #3, the Ronnie Kaplan Engineering, Peter Revson Javelin seen in the background in the above picture. They had some problems getting the car off the transporter so Jan and I lent a hand. We even earned \$5.00 each as "extras" in the commercial. After the shoot they let Jan take the car out for a few laps, see below. Jan took the producer out in the car. For those not knowing Bridgehampton, the main straight ended in a flat out right hand downhill into another right hander requiring a downshift to third. When Jan downshifted, the clutch never came back up! Freewheeling into this second righthander the car spun out into the sand in a cloud of dust. Back on the track Jan had to pick the clutch pedal up off the floor with his foot after each shift. Completeing the lap Jan asked the producer if he wanted to go for another lap, the producer declined.
